Introduction

Dear brothers, Officers, and Governors of the Midwest District of Kappa Kappa Psi, my name is Samuel James Faulkner. I am currently a second-year graduate student at Missouri State University and an active brother of the Epsilon Psi chapter of Kappa Kappa Psi. I am pursuing my Master's of Computer Science and plan to complete this around the Spring semester of 2020. I have been a part of an ensemble every semester since first coming to Missouri State University including Marching Band, Basketball Band, Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, and more recently Community Band. My primary instrument is Trumpet, but I will play whatever needs to be filled in the ensemble. I am currently in our University's Community Band in the Trumpet section.

I'm currently holding the office for the Midwest District's Member-At-Large as well as my own chapter's office of Sergeant-At-Arms. Many know what the Member-At-Large does, but the Sergeant-At-Arms position is a custom one Epsilon Psi created. It is, at it's bare bones, a combination of the Ritual Master and Parliamentarian that most other chapters in the District utilize.

The officer position that I wish to run for is Midwest District President. Although this nomination packet contains the mindset of running for Midwest District President, I would be willing to accept a nomination for any other Midwest District Office. After already serving on the council for one year, I wish to continue serving the District however I can where ever they may need me.

Qualifications

The position of Midwest District President requires a lot of responsibility as they essentially become the face of the Midwest District. The Midwest District Constitution lists off many requirements and qualities of someone hoping to be the Midwest District President. The first half of the President's responsibilities are similar to the Chapter President's responsibilities in the National Constitution. They must preside at all meetings, vote at National Convention, appoint the committees, act as a representative of the Midwest District and more. Having been a Midwest District Officer as well as a Chapter Officer, these requirements will be more than satisfied. It's the next sentence that gets into the meat and potatoes of the President's duties.

"The Midwest District President shall be responsible for coordinating the Convention with host chapters. These responsibilities include finding speakers, creating a business agenda and coordinating with Tau Beta Sigma in the overall schedule."

Essentially, the Midwest District President is in charge of coordinating with the Tau Beta Sigma Midwest District Council to plan next year's convention. The sooner things can be done, the easier this task becomes. After watching the planning process for this year's convention, I know where the pitfalls can be and what the timeline is like to get everything set up. Most of the work comes from the host chapter by getting rooms for workshops, registration, hotel rooms, and more figured out. The President works on the backend by reaching out to members of the National

Council to find those that can present subjects brothers want to attend to bring back to their chapters, setting up a schedule for the entire weekend on the Kappa Kappa Psi side, coordinating with the host chapter to help them stay on track and schedule so they can be relaxed through the whole process, and so much more. While this seems very stressful and difficult, as long as the President is mindful of the deadlines, stays focused, and keeps a list of what needs to be done, then it boils down to staying on top of communication.

The rest of the Midwest District President's position is not listed, but is more implied. The Midwest District President works with the rest of the District Council to help them achieve what they set out to achieve once elected. Our current Midwest District President, has done everything he can to make sure that he had an answer to any question that the rest of the council had. He also made sure to ask the council what questions and thoughts we had on any decision that was made to make sure it was the majority decision and stayed fair. That is the kind of President that will strive to be if elected to this position.

As for the qualities of the Midwest District President? There are numerous that are listed out in the Officer Guidelines document that can be found on the Midwest District Website. I will be more than happy to explain how I fit each of these qualities if you feel I do not meet them based on my resume.

Why President Specifically?

I've always had a deep passion for Kappa Kappa Psi. Ever since I joined the fraternity back in the Fall semester of 2013. My experiences with the band programs I've been a part of have shown me how much good it does for a lot of people. Kappa Kappa Psi is not just a fraternity. It is a family. After serving as the Midwest District Member-At-Large this past year, I've come to see that in all of the chapters in our District. The Midwest District has gone through many hardships this past year, which I believe has brought us closer together. That is why I think now is a perfect time to run for District President. My goal as Midwest District Member-At-Large was to bring the district itself closer together and make it feel smaller. I want to continue this goal as the Midwest District President. With that being my goal, I have four different ideas, in no particular order, I plan to implement to help achieve this goal.

The first plan I have is to work with the next Midwest District Vice President to try and take the Road to Wisdom to the next level. I plan to have us achieve this by gathering the schedules from each Vice President of Membership and plan a lesson that is taught by members of the District Council to multiple chapters at once. This idea came from the District Officers introducing themselves to the membership candidate classes instead of having the Vice President of Membership list them off. So by working with the next Midwest District Vice President, we can take this idea further by scheduling chapters to have some lessons taught by other members of the District Council and maybe even the National Council, if the schedule permits. I believe that by getting the membership candidates excited about district related events, they can in turn get their chapter excited about attending the events as well. Plus, it will have the added effect of showing the membership candidates what Kappa Kappa Psi is like outside of their chapter.

The second plan I have is to work with the next Midwest District Secretary/Treasurer to develop a district-wide fundraiser for all chapters to utilize. My idea behind this is that chapter representation at district events such as District Days or Leadership Conferences aren't relatively diverse. It usually consists of the host chapter, the District Officers, and a few brothers from neighboring chapters. From the brothers I've talked to about this, the main two reasons they do not attend these events is because they can't afford to go or they had other obligations. We cannot control the latter of these two problems; however, if we can raise funds for the district to give to chapters specifically for traveling to district events, then my hope is to expect a much larger turnout to all of these events.

The third plan I have is to work with the next Member-At-Large to improve the Pen Pal Program that I started during my term as Member-At-Large. I will admit that this program was a logistical nightmare whilst I was planning it. I hope that by passing it off to a new Member-At-Large, the program could be drastically improved and help achieve the goal I want us to achieve. I can say for sure that a few of the pairs I made in the Pen Pal group, they have made new lifelong friends. Now we only need to keep it going and get that spark to go through more brothers in the district.

The fourth plan I have is to develop a chapter buddy system, tentatively named the "Strive Higher Together" program. This system would work the same as the Pen Pal program did, but chapter-to-chapter instead of brother-to-brother and without a point system. My thought process behind this is to pair chapters with one another so that the chapters can help improve each other on the chapter level. For example, a chapter that excels with Brotherhood events but struggles in the aspect of Service could be paired with a chapter that excels in Service but falls to the wayside with Brotherhood. By pairing these chapters together, the Officer Corps from each chapter can see what each other does to excel where the other lacks, thus bringing both chapters to "Strive Higher Together."

Conclusion

I appreciate you going through my novel of a nomination packet. I believe that President is something I can truly make my own with this organization and allow me to strive even higher. I have proposed many different ideas that I plan to implement if elected to the position of Midwest District President. I will say that if I am extended any other position, then I will gladly accept that position and continue to pitch my respective idea to my fellow officers in the hopes to achieve my personal goal of bring the Midwest District closer as a district.
