MIDWEST DISTRICT SECRETARY-TREASURER PLATFORM

Abstract

I believe I am qualified for the position of Midwest District Secretary-Treasurer because of my leadership, organization, communication, and problem-solving skills. I also have previous experience managing multiple multi-thousand-dollar accounts as Xi Chapter Treasurer. This included multiple fundraisers that raised over \$3,000 for the band. My leadership and communication skills stem from serving as Xi Chapter President this past year. These opportunities taught me about working with different types of people as well as the impact one organization can make. I want to continue to become more involved in Kappa Kappa Psi and believe serving as on the Midwest District Council can be beneficial to my personal growth and the growth of the district. For Secretary-Treasurer, I have three main goals: (1) to increase the transparency of district finances with the chapters, (2) to increase chapter collaboration and interaction through fundraisers, and (3) to increase the spread of fundraising ideas throughout the district. In completing all of these goals, I hope to help the district grow closer and continue to strive for the highest.

Background and Objectives

My experience in my own chapter has provided me with skills that are beneficial for this position. I served as Historian, Treasurer, President, and briefly as Secretary during an awkward transition between Secretaries in the Xi Chapter. As Historian, I maintained archives and social media accounts. My goal was to get more involved with the chapter my first year as an active and I thought being the person that took pictures and posted them would be a good start. In the middle of my term as Historian, our Secretary quit and I became the acting Secretary until a new one was elected. I took chapter meeting minutes and headed Outreach Committee. These responsibilities were given to me unexpectedly so I had to adapt quickly. The experience taught me how to run a committee meeting as well as what was important to type when taking meeting minutes. The following year, I served as Treasurer and headed the first Finance Committee of the chapter. During these meetings, we brainstormed new fundraisers, but I also taught my committee how the chapter finances and accounts were organized and why. A primary responsibility was managing a stateissued raffle license. As part of this, I submitted quarterly reports detailing how and when we made and spent money. My chapter also partnered with Alpha Iota at CU Boulder to do a Rockies game fundraiser. This allowed us to work more games and therefore make more money for our chapters. Working a food stand at a baseball game for eight hours is a really good way to get to know brothers from other chapters while also helping both chapters. For my final term, I served as President. Here is where I learned the most. I learned what it meant to be a good leader and how important communication is. Organization was key in order to submit national paperwork on time as well as keep all other committees and officers on track. My next step in Kappa Kappa Psi is to serve on the District Council. I hope to contribute equally as much as I learn from serving on the council, with the hopes that I can complete the follow goals as Midwest District Secretary-Treasurer:

- 1) Increase transparency of district finances with the district chapters
- 2) Increase chapter collaboration and interaction through fundraisers
- 3) Increase the spread of fundraising ideas throughout the district

Methods

I plan to utilize my background and skills in order to completed the above objectives. My experience as chapter Treasurer made me realize that being transparent with finances are crucial to a functioning chapter. Brothers prefer to know where money is coming from and, more importantly, where money is going. Our multiple accounts were confusing, but I always informed the chapter of when and how much was spent on what. This kept the communication open and brothers were comfortable knowing what was going on behind the scenes. To do this on a district level, I believe it would be a good idea to have a quarterly report or something similar that was emailed out to the district chapters. Even if no one read them, the information would be out there. Clear communication is key to build connections between the District Council and the chapters. I also hope the knowledge of the district finances sparks more of an interest in fundraisers on the district level.

Increasing interactions between the District Council and all the chapters is a step towards increasing chapter collaboration across the district. Organizing a fundraiser that stimulates healthy competition among chapters would help with that. Going beyond chapter vs chapter competition, it would be a bonus if chapters competed together such as by state or combing a smaller chapter with a larger chapter to equal out the competition. Something like "Penny Wars" at District Days or throughout the school year with District Days being check-in points could be initiated. The goal would be for this to be a fundraiser at the district level. However, it could also just be listing how much money each chapter fundraised to see which combination of chapters could fundraise the most in a school year.

Keeping with the theme of increasing interactions between the chapters, I think building a working document with all the different fundraisers chapters have done over the years. This will allow ideas to spread and help chapters get out of a rut of doing the same fundraisers year after year. It can be a quick list so that chapters will have to reach out and ask exactly how that fundraiser was conducted.

Results

From this experience. I hope to help the district and myself grow. On the district level, I want chapters to become more involved with the district's finances instead of it being "behind the scenes." I believe it is hard to fundraise for something if you don't know where it is going or why you are raising the money. With that, suggestions for how the money should be spent can also be taken into consideration. Having fundraisers that bring together chapters as well as make money would be beneficial to the chapter in multiple ways and not feel like a burden. I know there will be bumps in the road, but I think I have the skills to set a foundation for future Secretary-Treasurers to continue to have more fundraisers that require interaction between chapters. I could easily start documentation outlining the steps on how to organize the annual fundraising competition. Additionally, I hope to contribute just as a leader and Brother in Kappa Kappa Psi. I hope brothers from other chapters will be comfortable in approaching me with and fundraising or finance questions or just for guidance in general.

I see this as an excellent opportunity to meet more people across the country with similar interests. Over my time as an active brother, I have interacted more and more with other chapters and traveled from the east to the west side of the district. It's so interesting to see what other chapters do since no two are quite the same. I'd like to take back what I learned from the district level and other chapters to the Xi Chapter so that I can continue to help them grow. I also wish to continue to set an example for my chapter about leadership and being involved in Kappa Kappa Psi as a whole, beyond our university band. I believe we set a good foundation at our school and are in a position to continue to expand our influence and involvement and I hope this is a good step in that direction.

Conclusion

I am extremely excited to be running for Midwest District Secretary-Treasurer. Serving on the Midwest District Council has always been a thought in my mind, but I wanted to wait until I did not have a chapter officer position. I believe I have the skills and experiences to fulfill the responsibilities outlined in the District Constitution as well as add more to the position. I hope to contribute all I can to this organization and the district.
