I gathered a surplus of knowledge about how to travel as a chapter, and believe that other chapters would benefit from this information. Here is a document that will aid chapters who have never traveled as a large group or want to find new innovative ways to do so. This document serves as a formula to follow, and by doing so any chapter in our district will have the tools to experience conventions and create meaningful relationships within the district and across chapters. Traveling as a chapter is a great way to promote brotherhood, leadership, musicianship, and service, and offers a great chance to engage brothers in our fraternity in ways they never might have before.

WHY IS CONVENTION IMPORTANT?

Convention is a great time for fraternal bonding and continuing education. There is nothing like the convention experience!

1. BROTHERHOOD

There are not many times that you can meet up with hundreds of brothers for a fun-filled weekend.

Convention is the perfect opportunity for that experience. The relationships you make at convention will create a lasting bong unlike any other. Additionally, the connections between districts and brothers will be something that we can all cherish forever.

2. CONTINUING EDUCATION

At convention, you may get the chance to sit in on workshops, reading bands, and educational experiences. New district officers are elected, and each chapter gets a vote and a stake in the future of the district. This is a great place for your voice to be heard, and for you to learn so much more about the fraternity!

TIMELINE

September/October

- Figure out when & where convention is
- Ask if chapter members would be interested in traveling as a group
- Establish a few people to head the planning process

November/December

- Begin looking for financial support from your university
- Begin fundraising or planning the finances of the trip
- Clearly outline costs for chapter members so they can prepare

January

- Research and explore accommodation options
- Explore transportation options
- Finalize numbers for the above options and present them to the chapter

February

- Make a final decision on accommodations
- Give chapter members a finalized cost of attendance
- Decide on transportation plan

March

- Finish up reservations & register for convention
- Pack your bags
- Head out to convention

PHASE ONE: PLANNING & FUNDING

PLANNING-

Planning for group travel includes many steps that can easily become overwhelming. It is important to recruit a friend to help with the process. It is also a good idea to work with your chapter's treasurer. They can provide a lot of funding guidance and support throughout the process.

FUNDING-

There are several ways you can help fund your trip. One of those is to look for activity and organization funding at your university. Often times, the funding comes with stipulations so make sure you ask your student engagement office what requirements you need to fulfill to get the funding.

PHASE TWO: BOOKING & NUMBERS

BOOKING-

When you are booking accommodations for your group, be sure you know the rules and regulations for the establishment. For example, if you book an airbnb that allows 12 people but you have 13, contact the host to see if they will allow it, or if you need to find a different accommodation. The last thing you want is to travel to a new city and not have an accommodation suitable for the group.

NUMBERS-

Numbers are so important for planning convention! It is important to determine the number of people traveling with you as soon as a month before convention. The number of people you have coming with you can determine what accommodation you book, how you are traveling, and how much information you may need to compile if you are using university funds.

PHASE THREE: FINALIZING & PREPARING

FINALIZING-

When finalizing your plans, make sure to check that your accommodations have been confirmed, members are getting registered for convention, and any paperwork you need to fill out for your university is turned in on time. When our university helped fund our trip, we had to turn in a form one week prior to the trip, detailing the students attending, what cars were driving, and the contact info for all the students. Make sure items like these are wrapped up so you can have a stress free and fun convention!

PREPARING-

Finally, it is time to prepare for the trip! Pack your bags and don't forget souvenir and food money. Make sure all members are registered, gas is in the car, and your pin is in your bag because you are ready for a fun and informational time at convention with your brothers from all around!

DEBRIEFING

When you get home from convention, I suggest you do two things to complete the planning process and the experience:

1. PAPERWORK

If you traveled on your university's funds, you will likely need to turn in receipts or other paperwork to get your reimbursements. This will likely need to be done within a week post-attendance.

2. SHARING THE EXPERIENCE

Once you get home, I highly suggest compiling some photos and information from the event to share with your chapter. From business to brotherhood, share it all so that chapter members who were not in attendance can still see what was going on!

FUNDRAISING IDEAS

Fundraising can be very successful without elaborate planning and a large task force. All you need is a few brothers and some good ideas!

GARAGE SALE-

Clean out all of the old junk you may have lying around and gather some brothers for a community garage sale. My tip is pricing everything as a dollar. It is easy to do, and you will sell a lot!

BAKE SALE-

If you have some good bakers in your chapter, consider having a bake night to prepare bagged treats. This is such an easy way to make money and only requires 1-2 people at the booth.

ICE CREAM BAR-

Set up a table at your campus with individual ice cream cups and root beer floats. This is a super yummy and fun way to make money. You can also market your chapter and participate in a little bit of campus outreach.

BONDING IDEAS

It is not often that chapters get a chance to spend time together and not do work. Take some time to have fun with your brothers and bond!

GROUP DINNER-

There is nothing better than gathering around the table for a hot meal. Consider going to a group dinner or working together to cook a large meal. Spaghetti is always easy and the time spent together is priceless!

GAME NIGHT-

Nothing compares to a good competitive game night. Have members bring their favorite games. Whether it is Settlers of Catan, Ticket to Ride, or Monopoly, you are sure to have some fun!

SOMETHING LOCAL-

Perhaps the city holding convention has an event happening, a famous park, or something fun like a bowling alley. This is a great way to sight-see and spend quality time with brothers.

FLEXIBLE ACCOMMODATIONS

There are many options for accommodations with groups and it is important to explore them all! A good option is one that fits the group best!

HOST HOTEL-

Typically, the host chapter will have a hotel accommodation option set up for you to book. This is usually very close to the convention site, near other brothers in the district, and sometimes the site of the banquet. It is a great option!

AIRBNB-

Airbnb is a great option for larger groups. I have found that it typically offers a lower cost per person, but is often times further away from the convention site. The airbnb usually offers a kitchen and on site laundry, making it an often cheaper alternative to hotels.

LOCAL BROTHERS-

If you are traveling with a small group and are very good friends with local brothers or family, you may be able to stay with them to get a little to no cost option. Staying with brothers is nice because they can sometimes show you around in the extra time!

CLOSING & RESOURCES

Overall, convention needs to be experienced by more than just a few brothers. Traveling and participating should be an option for everyone.
